Addressing peace and justice issues in our parish, local community and world, this ministry team focuses on the dignity and protection of human life, the dignity of work and workers' rights, and the well-being of the community.

**Outreach/Emergency Assistance:** Assisting our parish and community, we identify unmet needs and promote solutions to meet those needs.

**Respect Life Ministry:** All human life, from conception to natural death, is sacred and worthy of respect and protection. We advocate these beliefs through prayer, outreach, and social functions.

**Prayer Shawl:** Through our talents of knitting and crocheting, we turn yarn into wraps that are interwoven with prayers. Those who receive these handmade expressions of love are lifted by the spiritual comfort they experience while wearing their prayer shawls.

**Prayer Chain:** A dedicated group of parishioners prays daily for requested intentions, for the spiritual needs of the church, and for our members, community, and world.

**Kairos:** Aiming to build strong Christian communities inside prison walls, Kairos shares God's love to inmates and their families.

**Senior Outreach:** Provides information and referral resources for parish seniors and their families.

### FAITH FORMATION

**Adult Faith Formation:** Lifelong faith formation programs include retreat days and parishwide faith study studies.

**Baptismal Preparation:** Volunteers for this ministry will lead Baptism preparation classes, greet parents/godparents and their families and assist them with completion of required paperwork.

**Bible Study:** Encounter the Word of God through study and discussion of sacred scripture. Groups meet on Thursday evenings or Friday mornings.

**Vacation Bible School (V.B.S.):** This is a high-energy, scripture-based half-day camp for children ages four through nine. High-school-age crew leaders and adult coordinators are needed to help with games, snacks, crafts, music, faith, and more.

**Child and Youth Faith Formation:** The Faith Formation program serves the children and youth of our Parish grades PreK-12 to promote lifelong discipleship in the Catholic faith through age appropriate religious education. Volunteers for the programs serve as catechists, aides, and Youth Ministry leaders.

**Small Christian Communities:** Small groups engage members in close relationships, centered on our faith in the Lord. The heart of the program is faith-sharing around the Sunday reading

**RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults):** This program welcomes adults who have the desire to know more about the Catholic faith and would like to explore the journey toward becoming Catholic. A co-program is the RCIA amended for children designed for nonbaptized children who desire to become one with us in faith.

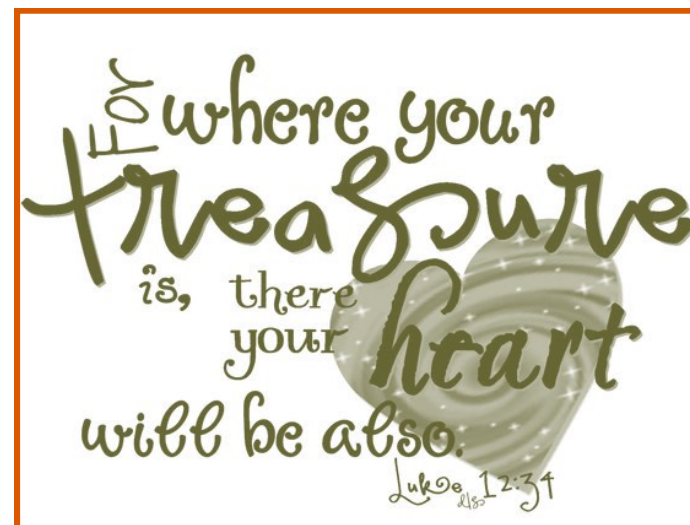

**Altar Linen Care** (secretary@allsaintscnc.org) Volunteers launder and care for the linens used in all Masses. Training and a guidebook are provided.

**Altar Servers** (altarserver@allsaintscnc.org) Men and women 9 years old (fourth grade) and up serve the priest as he presides over the liturgy, and our parish through worship and prayer.

**Arts & Environment** (secretary@allsaintscnc.org) This ministry creates a respectful, inviting devotional and fitting setting in the church. By engaging all senses of the parishioners, we open our hearts to fully experience and participate in the liturgy of God.

**Greeters & Ushers** (usher@allsaintscnc.org) Greeters and Ushers people coming into church and make them feel greet you with a smile and assist you in finding seating, directing you to where you need to go, and preparing and presenting the offertory.

**ExtraOrdinary Ministers of Holy Communion** (em@allsaintscnc.org) Those who minister communion serve the Body of Christ at the Eucharistic table and build up the Body through the way we live. Our love for the Eucharist is evident in a mature and lively faith which enables us to bring Christ to all we meet long after the liturgy has ended.

**Lectors** (lector@allsaintscnc.org) The Lector proclaims the Good News of Jesus Christ, making God present to the gathered community.

**Music, Choir, Band, & Bells** (music@allsaintscnc.org) A community of believers, friends, and family pray together and share the musical talents that God has given us with our parish.
